

Brunea's involvement in the murder of Kathy Wilson.

Why was Kathy Wilson murdered?

Why was there so much covering up?

She was seen alive several days after her disappearance on May 18th, 1988 from her lunch break, beaten badly on one side of her face, at a trailer in the woods of Lander, Pennsylvania, at the home of a man who would soon afterward be convicted of murder; and drug trafficking; and who was a founder of a local biker gang, the "Brotherhood";

Kathy's husband Mark told police immediately after her disappearance, that he had just the day before, thrown his no longer-best friend out of their home; Chris Brunea had been high school friends with Mark; they had a falling out; Mark mentioned to police that Brunea had been at Mark's father's death bed when his father died; an unusual statement, possibly connecting Brunea to wrongdoing in that regard, as his interest has been seen as theft of assets in dead men's estates- in my father's case, even before Dad died; lying to my father about me; perhaps the same happened to Mark Wilson.

Seeing of Kathy Wilson alive, beaten up, a few days after she went missing, twenty miles from her home and one mile from where her body lay and deteriorated for a year and a half before being found by children playing in the woods also connects two other testimonies in court; where a woman appeared to be trying to get the attention of a passing car; the two separate people who testified; their testimonies had been thrown out of court as they were not specifically on May 18th, 1988, the day Kathy became missing. Now we see those testimonies were correct; it was Kathy Wilson; the three sightings add up. She was there, in Lander a few days after May 18th, 1988; alive; at first sighting, did not try to escape; then after she knew she was about to be taken to a woods and killed, she did try.

The indication there was that Kathy Wilson trusted her abductors; or the people she was staying with, after she was beaten badly, as she did not try to run. She may have known she could not go back to her home and place of work looking the way she did; bruised, beaten up. She may have gone willingly to the trailer in the woods; after being struck by an angry lover.

That theory makes sense, as she did not try to escape when the neighbor was three feet from her and did not give him indication that she was there against her wishes. If she had been struck by abductors, she would have most likely not been free to walk around the yard as she was; and to see a neighbor close up. It appears Kathy Wilson thought she was with 'friends' when she was actually at the home of a murderer

When it became clear the people holding her planned to hurt her, she tried to get help. No one did help, or knew her plight.

The neighbor who saw her alive and beaten up, wearing a bandana on her head, did not go to police that day. He had been threatened by Earl Barnes, who was really Patrick

Arnold; the biker; Barnes had threatened him that day- he and his wife were afraid of Barnes and his connection with bikers. The neighbor did not know Earl Barnes was Patrick Arnold; and did not know Barnes would be going to prison for murder.

If he had immediately gone to police; Kathy Wilson may have never been killed.

A year and a half later, when her skeletal remains were found a mile away off Lindell Road, the witness watched Earl Barnes take everything Barnes owned out of his trailer, throw it in a fire and burn it; "bright enough to light up five football fields".

Then Barnes left- and did not return for years.

When he felt safe that Barnes had gone, the neighbor went to police with what he had seen. He told me the police refused to investigate Barnes. Nothing came of the report. I don't know the date of his statement to police; don't know who he told; what type of police; he told me he told several. I don't know if that statement ever reached the Prosecution, Joe Massa; or Barry Smith, the Defense Attorney for Jay William Buckley, who was accused of rape and murder. If police records were made and filed, that can be learned. If not; we can only go on the word of the witness.

Three time-specific events occurred;

1. Brunea was thrown out of the Wilson home, the day before she disappeared.
2. She was seen, "beaten bad", a few days later, one mile from where her body lay decaying; at the home of Patrick Arnold, a convicted murderer.
3. Patrick Arnold was seen burning all of the contents of his trailer, on the same day Kathy Wilson's body was found; and Arnold then left and was gone for years.

I have no interest in Kathy Wilson, or any of the people involved in this sad and unsolved case; my only interest is showing involvement of Chris T. Brunea, Esquire.

My only interest in Brunea is to show connection between what happened to the Wilson family and what happened to my family.

In the case of my family, Mr. Brunea lied; misled; committed fraud; created a frivolous lawsuit; destroyed my reputation with those lies and accusations, and thereby destroyed my family. All of his actions were for his own personal gain. This I know, for absolute fact. There is no question whatsoever.

Has Chris Brunea changed? Was he not a bad man twenty years ago? Was he innocent of any involvement in the murder for hire of his best friend's wife? And yet implicated by his ex-best friend; who appears to have reason to no longer be friends at all with Brunea? Kelly Wilson, daughter of Kathy and Mark Wilson told me she had never ever heard the name of Chris T. Brunea; yet Brunea had been her father's best friend. Something happened somewhere along the line to eliminate Chris Brunea from Mark Wilson's life. Perhaps something he did eliminated himself from Kathy Wilson's life too.

Beck

Harold Thomas Beck has written two books about the Wilson murder; “Ripe for the Picking” and “The Wrong Arm of the Law”. Beck’s stance was that Jay William Buckley was completely innocent and that Buckley was set up to take the blame.

Beck’s position was that Kathy Wilson was murdered by her lover; according to Beck, she had several men over time; in Beck’s second book, he defines who the murderer was.

Beck says that he had personally been tricked by murderer, as the murderer had been asking many questions of Beck; Beck knew the man, a plumber; and did not suspect him of any connection until much later when he had an epiphany and realized why he had such interest in the case.

Beck’s claim is that the murderer was one of Kathy Wilson’s lovers, who was married to Kathy Wilson’s best friend, a sorority sister; that the marriage between this friend was an open marriage; but that the sorority sister did not know Kathy Wilson had been having sex with the sorority sister’s husband until later, after Kathy Wilson’s disappearance.

Beck’s solution was that Kathy Wilson became pregnant by this man; he learned of it, became angry and killed her.

Beck’s solution is simple. It involves only one person. It eliminates involvement of Chris Brunea and Earl Barnes / Patrick Arnold and the sightings of Kathy Wilson in Lander.

When I spoke with Beck, I asked if he remembered Chris T. Brunea. He responded, saying that Barry Smith had only brought up various individuals in order to show there were suspects other than his client, Jay William Buckley. Beck did not acknowledge Chris T. Brunea having been the number one suspect in the case.

Beck told me that he knows more about this case than anyone in the world. He has established himself as the authority. He has also suffered the burning of his home and restaurant, as someone did not like what Beck said; what questions he raised; and what awareness he presented.

Beck lives in Florida now, far from his burned home in Pennsylvania. He wants nothing to do with further investigation of the Kathy Wilson murder.

I can prove that errors exist In Beck’s second book, that are absolute lies. The lies were written in order to scare the murderer and those who were involved. Since those errors exist, both of the entire books cannot be trusted as truth.

Chris T. Brunea and Kathy Wilson

What I have presented here is connection between Chris T. Brunea and the murder of his best friend’s wife; Brunea being ordered to leave the Wilson home the day before she went missing. Mark Wilson said that Brunea left quietly. But, why was he there; what

was said? What damage had been done? What was planned before; or after? Only half a day went by from that time until Kathy Wilson left for lunch from work and never came back. After she disappeared the next day, several days went by before she was murdered. Why?

Chris T. Brunea and Arthur L. Maecker

The connection between Chris Brunea and that murder and the systematic murder of my father, Arthur Louis Maecker; by lying to a frail old, incompetent man; separating that old man from his family at the weakest time of his life; destroying the family with lies and actions of the court was vile, contrived and vicious.

Chris T. Brunea intentionally made every act with cunning and planned contempt, for his own personal gain.

Avoiding discovery of his actions in the murder of his best friend's wife is consistent with those actions twenty years later.

That connection is strong, and undeniable.

The connection between attorney Brunea and a criminal / murderer is obvious; Brunea was practicing law at the time Arnold was tried and convicted. Criminals are connected to lawyers; are confidants with lawyers; Arnold lived in Jamestown, Ny, Brunea lived in Jamestown, NY. That connection must be also clear.

Defense attorney Barry Smith established in trial, that Kathy Wilson was about to divorce her husband, Mark. Smith cast suspicion on her employer. Beck's books named her lovers; though all of that must be considered hearsay and not reliable. Since she was planning to seek counsel for divorce, it is likely she did have an affair.

That affair may have been Chris T. Brunea.

Beck described an argument that Kathy Wilson was pregnant at the time of her death. It was a well thought argument.

Brunea being thrown from the Wilson home , leading to Mark Wilson standing, glaring at Kathy Wilson at their daughter's baseball game that evening adds up to Mark being angered at Kathy; most likely in regard to the occurrence at their home earlier, with Chris T. Brunea.

Only Mark Wilson and Chris Brunea know the purpose of Brunea's visit to his ex-best friend's home on May 17th, 1988. The outcome shows that it was not about something good. The outcome of that evening at the baseball game shows something went very wrong in their meeting earlier. Kathy Wilson's disappearance after lunch the next day indicates there was a connection to the day before. That connection was with Chris T. Brunea, Esquire.

Investigator Herzog

Scrutinizing police records of investigating officer Herzog of Pennsylvania indicate connections that otherwise have no relevance. Officer Herzog obviously saw relevance in these reports, as they are the reports he chose to enter into the record.

Testimony of 17 year-old Michael Brown was used by Commonwealth Prosecutor Joe Massa to convict Jay Buckley of rape and murder.

Herzog's report shows that young Brown received a brand new Harley Davidson 883 Sportster motorcycle, purportedly from his parents. His parents worked in factories; drove an 8 year-old van; Brown was a high-school dropout and common thief.

Some time afterward, the motorcycle was wrecked in a crash by a friend of Brown's; no more was said about it.

Shelly Anderson was a girl both Brown and Buckley had sex with. According to Herzog's reports, Anderson really liked Brown, and no longer liked Buckley; she was Brown's age, Buckley was much older; Buckley had flattened her tires and broken her windshield wipers when he was angry at Anderson.

Anderson's testimony blended with Brown's perfectly, against Buckley; except one instance where they both made the same statement separately; and then both retracted the statement.

Shelly Anderson's testimony was against Buckley, as was Brown's; Anderson was placed at the scene of the abduction by Brown, yet she was never accused by Prosecution for any wrongdoing.

Anderson had left the Jamestown area on May 22nd; soon after Kathy Wilson went missing; and in perfect timing with the sighting of Kathy Wilson by three people. Anderson moved to several states, first California, and eventually Florida where she was apprehended and brought from for testimony at trial.

Anderson regularly purchased drugs for Brown; she was therefore connected to the supplier of drugs; Arnold went to prison for drug trafficking and murder.

Jay William Buckley had been convicted years before for theft of a car; where the owner was still in the car; it is possible he was planning to rape her as well; he drove wrecklessly, went through a red light and struck another car; that driver was killed in the accident.

Buckley's parole for those crimes was expiring on the very day Kathy Wilson disappeared, May 18th, 1988 was Buckley's last day of parole.

Buckley had friends who were involved in a tractor-trailer theft ring. At the time, in the nineteen eighties, there was a national push to break the theft rings. FBI named the operation " PacTrac".

Buckley was subpoenaed to testify against his friends for theft of trucks; against a man named Don Foster of Gerry, NY.

Buckley did not want to testify; attempted suicide and blamed the testimony as reason.

The testimony was to be in Missouri; date was May 15th, 1988. Buckley responded saying he could not make it then; the date was then extended by the court.

May 18th. 1988 was the date Kathy Wilson disappeared; Jay William Buckley was immediately the number one suspect for her disappearance; Buckley was immediately questioned by Jamestown police; Michael Brown was wired to record what Buckley had to say about Wilson's disappearance.

Buckley later was planning to go into business with a partner, to paint houses. The friend's girlfriend made statement to police that she overheard Buckley saying "I got paid to do it" regarding Kathy Wilson being a missing person. Buckley's friend refused to testify; and told police he would only testify to having heard Buckley say that, if Don Foster would agree to it too. Don Foster was Buckley's friend that Buckley testified against in Missouri, for truck theft.

The 'extras' I mentioned here indicate connections completely eliminated in the prosecution of William Jay Buckley for the rape and murder of Kathy Wilson, on only one day, May 18th 1988.

Several other people vacated the Jamestown area immediately after the Kathy Wilson disappearance as well.

One man, Ray Strickland, went to California; left his paycheck, did not get refund for his motel room he had prepaid. He had been late returning from lunch on May 18th, 1988 and told a coworker he wished he had whiskey in his cup instead of coffee.

When police interviewed him in California, his wife had a broken jaw; they claimed she had been kicked by her horse.

Another man, Gary Erickson, would get drunk and tell people he had murdered Kathy Wilson. He moved to South Carolina where he was held in jail and told police there that he had killed her.

There were other sightings of someone looking like Kathy Wilson, from Florida, after the case was aired nationally on television.

The sightings in Lander, PA however, are substantiated by the statement of a man who stood three feet from her a few days after she went missing. Those statements make sense.

The unconnected and seemingly extraneous information can be weeded out; put aside; and substituted by the time-specific events that are substantiated; Chris Brunea, Patrick Arnold.

The details are not known, and maybe never will be.

Whether Chris Brunea had an affair with his ex-best friend's wife, got her pregnant and then Brunea went to their home to confront his ex-friend Mark can only be guessed; Whether Kathy and Chris Brunea were caught together by her husband mark can only be guessed; What affairs went on the day before she went missing can only be construed- from the facts we know; facts Mark Wilson told police immediately after his wife disappeared.

Mark Wilson implicated his ex-best friend Chris T. Brunea immediately when she went missing.

She was seen at a murderer's home a few days later;

Lawyers know criminals;

Murderers murder; possibly more than once.

Crooked lawyers start somewhere; behavior repeats itself;

All other information now becomes secondary.

The murder of Kathy Wilson of Jamestown, NY can be solved with a new approach to new evidence and established history of a man without conscience, Chris T. Brunea.

Investigators can resolve a mystery the entire nation remembers- and wants the answer to.
